

Junior Innovation Challenge - Guidelines

1. Introduction

The Junior Innovation Challenge is part of the **National Innovation Challenge (NIC) – 4th Edition**, organised by the Mauritius Research and Innovation Council (MRIC). It aims to inspire and nurture the next generation of innovators in Mauritius, Rodrigues and the Outer Islands.

This competition provides a platform for participants to develop creative ideas, solve real-life problems, and showcase their talent.

2. Categories

The Junior Innovation Challenge is divided into two categories:

Young Innovator Category

Open to participants aged **6 to 11 years**. The focus is on simple, creative, and hands-on projects that encourage teamwork and problem-solving.

Rising Innovator Category

Open to participants aged **12 to 18 years**. The focus is on more advanced projects, not limited to applying knowledge, coding, design, engineering, and research, with attention to the practicality and potential impact of ideas.

3. Eligibility

- Open to all youngsters in Mauritius, Rodrigues, and the Outer Islands.
- Applications may be submitted individually or in groups of up to 5 members, with one chosen leader.

4. Participation

Participants are required to:

- 1. **Identify a problem** in their school, community, environment, or society.
- 2. **Propose an innovative solution** that is practical, creative, and beneficial.
- Explain how the idea will be developed further into a prototype, model, or concept during the Innovation Sprint.
- 4. Provide a **basic budget** to show how the seed funding will be used.

Submission of video applications can be done on the online application form or by forwarding the video link to us by email on nic@mric.mu and clearly indicating your full name and contact details.

5. Evaluation Criteria

Projects will be judged on:

- Innovativeness Is the idea original and creative?
- Practicality Can it be realistically implemented?
- Relevance Does it solve a real problem?
- Scalability Can it grow or be applied to other contexts?
- Impact How beneficial is it to people or the community?
- **Feasibility** Can it be done with available resources?





6. Process

Stage 1- Application (Sept – Nov 2025)

Submit online or via video before the deadline (28 November 2025).

Stage 2- Administrative Screening (Nov 2025)

Applications are checked for completeness.

Stage 3- Pre-selection (Nov 2025)

Shortlisting of promising ideas.

Stage 4- Audition Phase (Jan 2026)

Selected teams present their idea live to a **jury panel** and audience.

Stage 5- Innovation Sprint (Feb - May 2026)

Selected teams (10 Young Innovator + 10 Rising Innovator) receive **seed funding of Rs 10,000 each**.

They may benefit from mentorship and workshops to develop their projects.

Stage 6- Final Presentation (April 2026)

Teams showcase their final prototype/concept to the jury.

Award Ceremony (May 2026)

Winners are announced during a televised national ceremony.

7. Seed Funding

- Rs 10,000 per selected project
- Funds may be used for materials, simple equipment, or development costs.
- Not allowed: paying debts, covering school/home operational costs, or buying unrelated items.

8. Prizes

Young Innovator Category

1st Prize: Rs 50,000 + Trophy + Certificate 2nd Prize: Rs 35,000 + Trophy + Certificate 3rd Prize: Rs 25,000 + Trophy + Certificate

• Rising Innovator Category

1st Prize: Rs 50,000 + Trophy + Certificate 2nd Prize: Rs 35,000 + Trophy + Certificate 3rd Prize: Rs 25,000 + Trophy + Certificate Public Choice Award (each category)
Gift Voucher + Trophy + Certificate

9. Important Notes

- By applying, participants agree that projects may be filmed and featured in the National Innovation Challenge TV series.
- Teachers, parents and guardians are encouraged to support, but projects must be student-driven.
- Participation of children in the competition requires the consent of a parent or guardian.
- Participants must commit to all stages of the competition.

10. DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION

The Call for Ideas is open until the **28th of November 2025.** All applications will be treated on merit.
